Children's Liturgy is offered during Sunday Mass at St. John's

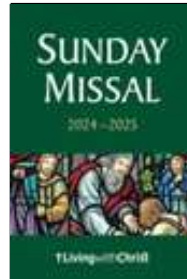
Volunteer Parish Custodian (Part-Time)
