It's that time of year again! Your 2026 envelopes will be at the back of the church December 1. Please give generously.

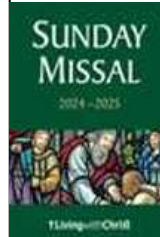


The CWL is collecting socks, mittens and toques (new or homemade) for the needy. A box is located at the back of the Church for your donations. Thank-you!
