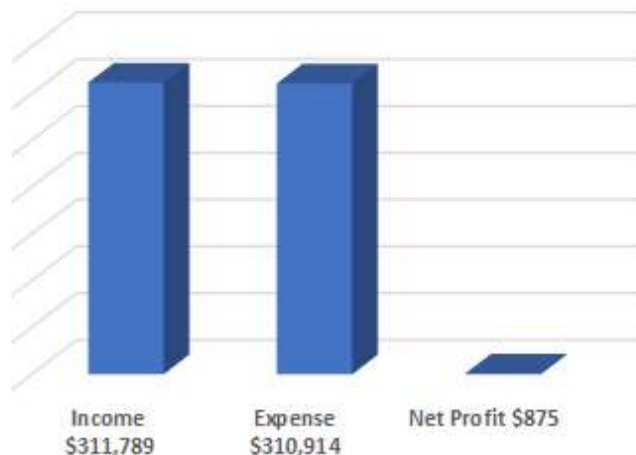
### The St. John/St. Philomena Catholic Women's League
