**Responsorial Psalm:** Psalm 117



**Second Reading:** Hebrews 12.11-13

The Assumption of Mary is one of the four Marian dogmas of the Catholic Church.[2] (The word 'assumption' derives from the Latin word *assumptiō* meaning "taking up"). Pope Pius XII defined it in 1950 in his apostolic constitution *Munificentissimus Deus* as follows: We proclaim and define it to be a dogma revealed by God that the

immaculate Mother of God, Mary ever virgin, when the course of her earthly life was finished, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven.[3] The declaration was built upon the 1854 dogma of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, which declared that Mary was conceived free from original sin, and both have their foundation in the concept of Mary as the Mother of God.[4] It leaves open the question of whether Mary died or whether she was raised to eternal life without bodily death.[3]

### ***The Big List of Church Volunteer Opportunities***

God has uniquely equipped every person in the Church with specific skills and gifts. As Christians, we are tasked with utilizing these gifts in our community and within our local church. This is a fantastic way to serve the church while simultaneously lightening the load of a church's staff. Volunteering has a spiritual benefit as well, an individual will often want to dive deeper into the life of the church. At the same time, they serve not only as a helping hand, but also as a witness of the Gospel message within the community. Below are several opportunities you might prayerfully consider taking part in.

**SACRISTAN:** Make sure that all preparations are made for the Celebration of the Eucharist.

**ALTAR SERVERS:** Help the Priest throughout the liturgy. Anyone who has received their First Holy Communion and is trained can participate.

**USHERS AND GREETERS:** Meet and greet people in a welcoming manner as they arrive at the Church.

**PRESENTERS FOR CHILDREN'S LITURGY OF THE WORD:** These people bring the young children of the parish to another room during the first half of Mass to help them understand the Scriptures in a non-adult language.

**READERS/LECTORS:** Play an important role in the Liturgy of the Word, as they proclaim and share the Word of God.

**EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION:** Assist the Priest to prepare and distribute the bread and wine to the people during the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

**LITURGICAL MUSICIANS:** While we are grateful for the musicians we have, it would be lovely to have our choir back in action.

**GIFT BEARERS:** Bring up the gifts of bread and wine during Preparation of the Gifts on our behalf.

**COLLECTORS:** Move among the people gathered to collect money for the Church and for those in need.

**PARISH COUNCIL MEMBERS:** Give their input to the overall operation of the Parish.

**PROPERTY AND FINANCE COMMITTEE:** Help plan the budget for the parish and make recommendations for work to be done for the coming year.

**GARDENERS:** Teams who help to beautify the outside surrounds of the Church.

**CHURCH DECORATORS:** Plan the decorations for the different Liturgical Seasons.
